### A Day in the Life of Zoo School

 12:30 - 13:30 - Behind-the-scenes tour of the white rhino  
 13:30 - 15:30 - Birds around the Zoo site (Diversity Unit)

#### Example Day Online:

09:00 - 10:00 - Meiosis (Genetics unit)  
 10:00 - 12:00 - Mendelian genetics (Genetics unit)  
 12:00 - 12:30 - Lunch  
 12:30 - 13:30 - Time to work on group genetics project  
 13:30 - 14:30 - Peer review of exercise lab (Animals: Structure and Function unit)  
 14:30 - 15:30 - Heart lesson (Animals: Structure and Function unit)

**Please note:** The Zoo School teacher will be available to offer additional support to students/parents by appointment.

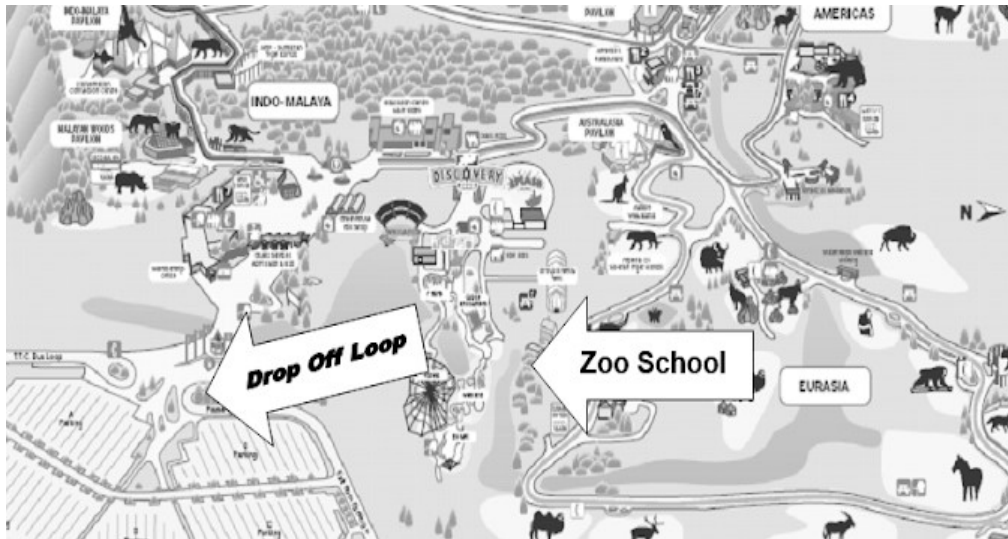
## Daily Requirements

### Students must provide:

- **Nut free** packed lunch/snacks
- Pens/pencils
- Appropriate indoor/outdoor clothing and footwear
- Sunscreen
- Sunglasses
- A hat
- Zoo School ID card (issued during the course)

### Student Drop-Off / Pick-Up

Zoo School operates between the hours of 9:00am and 3:30pm. On the first day of Zoo School at the Zoo, the class teacher will come to meet the students at the *Passenger Drop Off Loop* situated at the front of the Zoo. On subsequent days students will be expected to make their own way to the classroom, and arrive no later than 8:55 am. Zoo School Photo I.D. cards will be required for admission. At the end of the day students will make their own way out of the Zoo. If they are being picked up they should be met at the *Passenger Drop Off Loop*. Students driving their own vehicles will be provided with a parking pass each day.

### **Attendance Policy**

Zoo School recognizes that regular student attendance and punctuality are essential to student achievement and will communicate with parents/guardians regarding attendance issues.

It is essential that students meet the minimum number of instructional hours to successfully complete the course. Students will be expected to complete additional assignments for missed classes.

Zoo School will do its best to accommodate any students who have to be absent from class for a valid reason. If students are absent from class to an extent where it is deemed that they will be unable to complete all of the necessary course content, as set out by the Ministry of Education, a credit may not be granted.

### **Disclosure Policy**

Students will complete a mid-term test at the end of the second week of Zoo School. Upon receiving their grade students will have the option to drop the course; however no refund will be available. Dropping the course at this stage would result in no record of this course appearing on their Ontario Student Transcript. Withdrawals from the Zoo School course must be made in writing to the school no later than two instructional days following the issue of the mid-term report card. For all students continuing after this point Zoo School is required to disclose the student's performance and final grade on their Ontario Student Transcript.

### **Student Absence or Late Reporting Procedure**

Each absence or late arrival results in a lost learning opportunity which may not be regained. Parents/guardians are requested to call (416-392-5944) if the student will be absent or late. This will aid in the smooth running of the course, for all students.

### **Homework Policy**

Homework is an essential part of Zoo School. Students are expected to review their daily notes regularly and complete any assigned tasks. The major unit assignments comprise a major component of the final mark and completion of these assignments is necessary to be successful in Zoo School.
